- Increase the number of students receiving an A or B in English in year 3 (2021) from 52% (year 2, 2020) to 55% in 2021.
- Increase the percentage of students in the upper 2 bands (year 3 reading) to 45% in 2021.

Our initiatives include

- Provide focused and intensive teaching targeted at students requiring additional support in order to improve the quality of their demonstrations of learning against the relevant year level achievement standard.
- Employ an early years coach and head of department (curriculum) to work with P-2 staff and early childhood centres to support oral language, age appropriate pedagogies strategies, phonemic awareness and reading.
- Implement the Jimboomba Jumpstart Program for pre-prep students to enhance their preparedness and to assist in a smooth transition into primary school.
- Embed the 14 parameters (Sharratt) into teaching and learning across the school.
